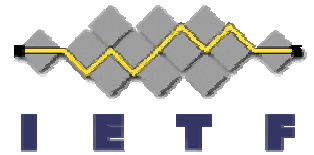
# Attendance at IETF 65, Dallas, March 2006



- 1324 registered attendees
  - Minneapolis 03/05 : 1133
- 36 countries
  - Minneapolis 03/05 : 28
- Celebrated the IETF's 20th birthday
- Serious problem encountered for visas for some participants
  - Thanks to ISOC for urgent intervention with the US State Department, but this is damaging to our openness

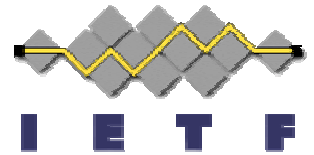


# Significant turnover in IESG in Dallas



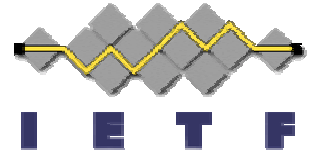
- Creation of new Real Time Applications and Infrastructure Area required two new Area Director positions
- Several long-serving Area Directors preferred to step down
- Consequence: we now have 15 Area Directors, of whom 7 are new
- No crisis, but there is a learning curve

# Document Actions and RFCs between IETF 64 and 65

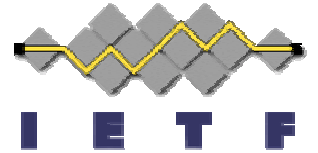


- 7 new WGs, 18 WGs closed
  - Approximately 125 WGs currently chartered across eight Areas
- 531 new I-Ds (56% in last 4 weeks)
- 995 updated I-Ds (58% in last 4 weeks)
- 106 IETF Last Calls
- 150 approvals
- About 184 RFCs published (96 standards/BCP)
  - Annual rate about 390 I-D approvals

# Not complacent, but proud...



- We have to continue reviewing and improving our process and administration. However:
  - The IETF produces almost 400 peer-reviewed technical documents a year from more than 100 vigorous WGs
  - They are still the reference documents for Internet infrastructure and for other standards bodies building on that infrastructure
  - The IETF remains open to any engineer who cares to participate, in person or by email
