RFC Editor has turned the corner on publishing RFCs.

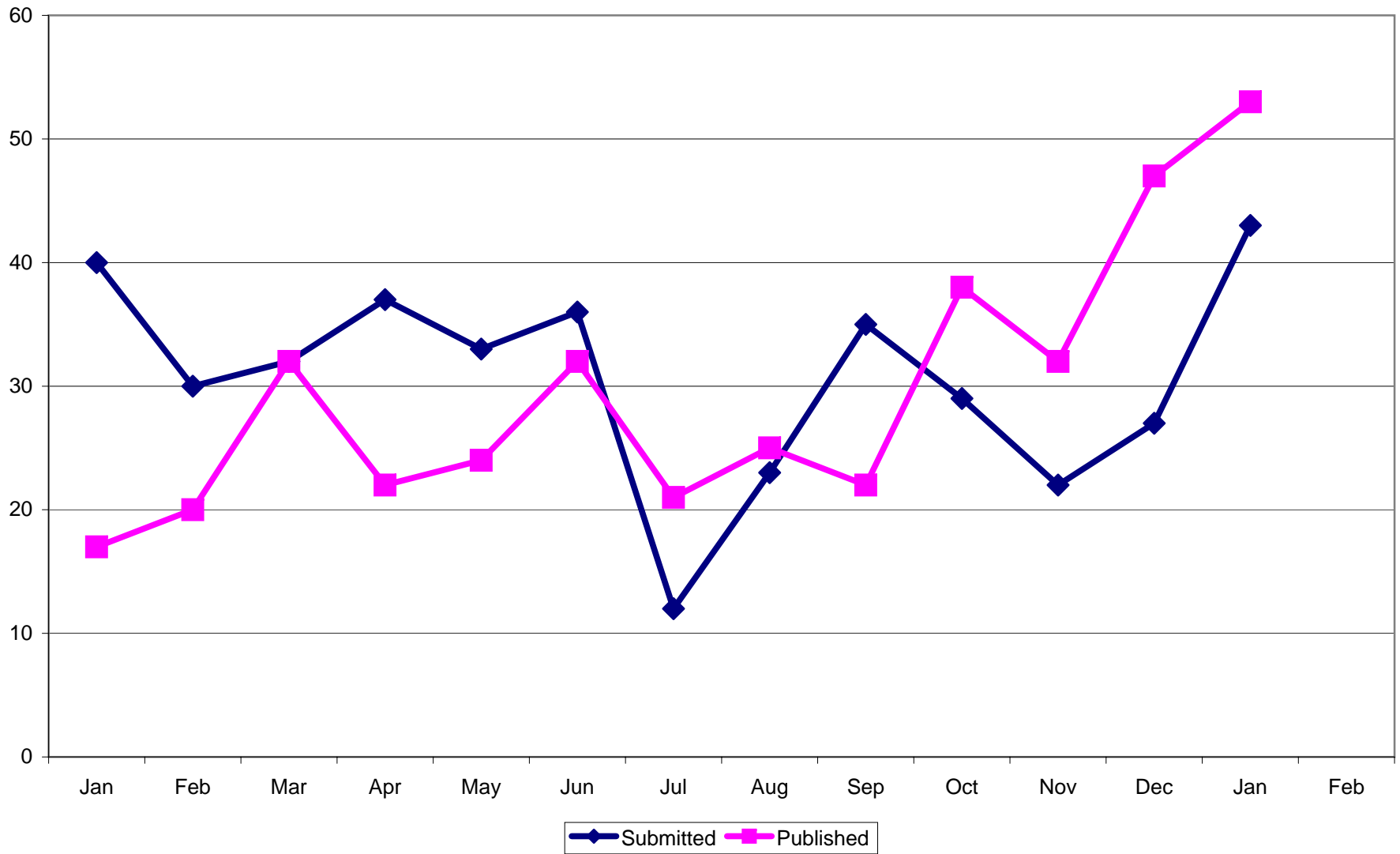
Elimination of backlog to be a reality by mid-2006.

Processing times to be significantly reduced in 2006.

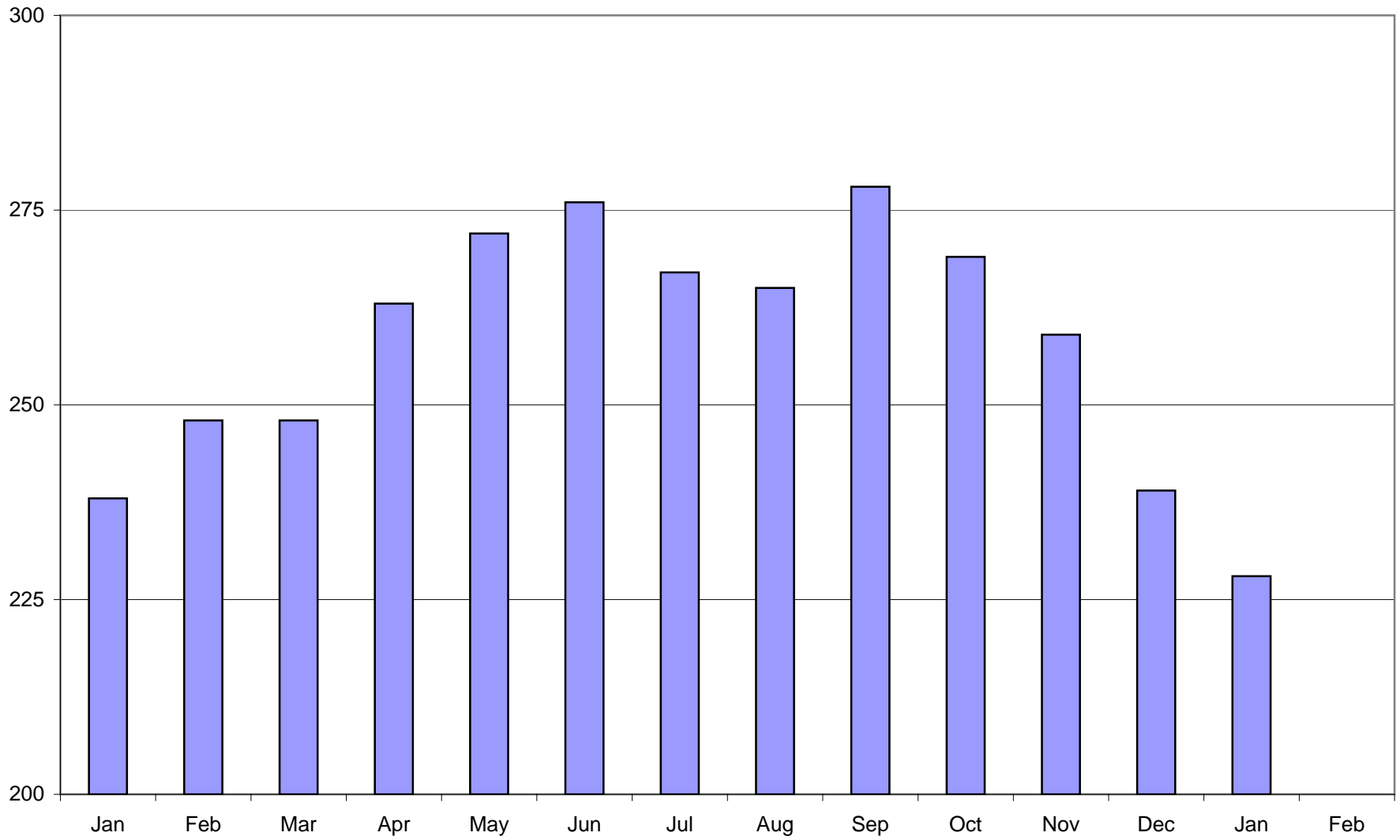
Editor at full staffing.

RFC Editor 2005 Budget \$754k, down \$47k

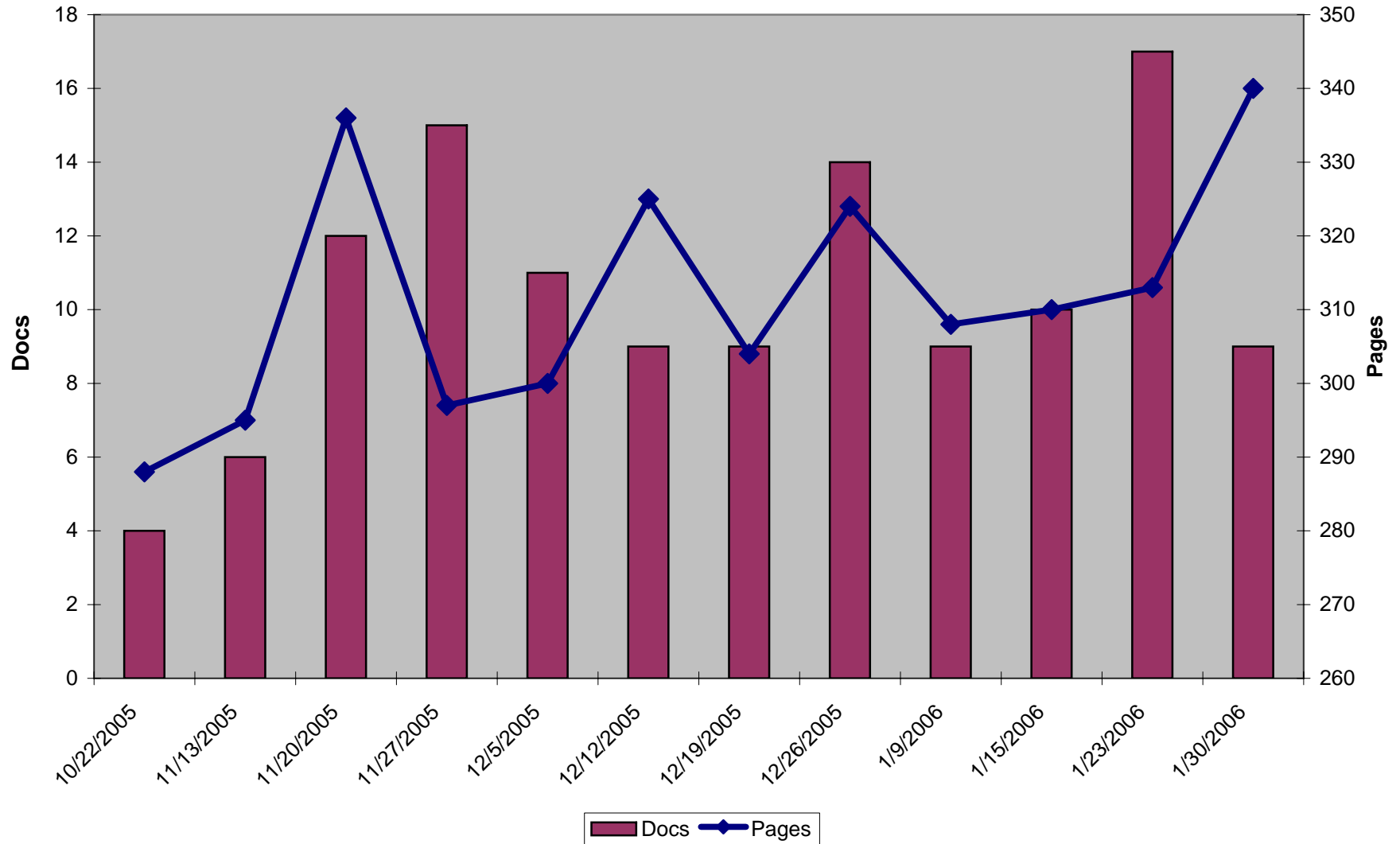
RFC Editor Activity 2005 - 2006
