

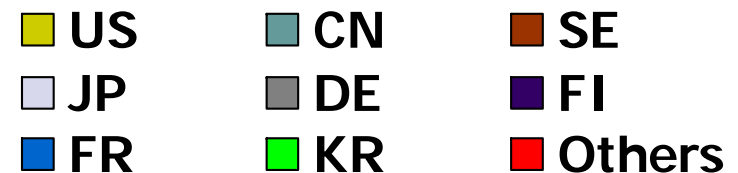
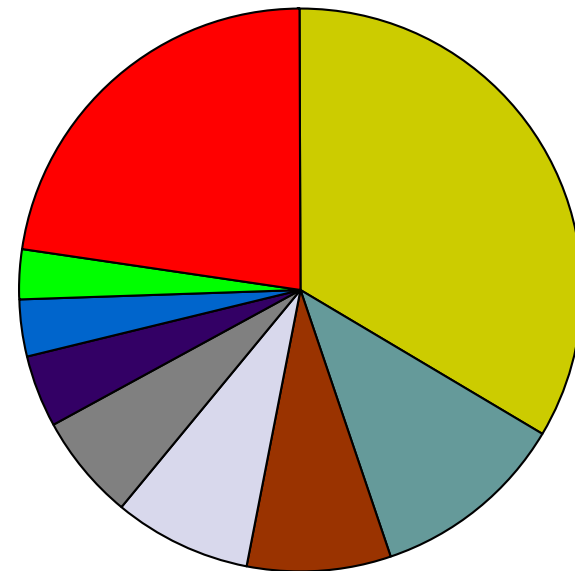
# IETF Status at IETF 75

# Registered by 24-July-2009

- 1189 people
  - 1028 people have paid
  - IETF 72 was 1183 people
  
- 60 countries
  - 52 countries with at least one person that has paid
  - IETF 72 was 48 countries



*IETF 72 was held in Dublin*

# IETF Activity since IETF 74 (27-Mar-2009 to 21-Jun-2009 )



- 8 New WG, 6 Closed WGs
  - Approximately 112 WGs currently chartered
- 222 New I-Ds (42 were updated, 12 more than once)
- 488 I-Ds were updated (again, some more than once)
- 102 IETF Last Calls
- 68 I-Ds approved for publication
- 70 RFCs published
  - 44 Standards Track
  - 1 BCP
  - 21 Informational
  - 4 Experimental

*These are measures of quantity; they say nothing about quality!*

# RFC Editor Activity since IETF 74 (actually Mar 2009-Jun 2009)



- Published 120 RFCs (about 2868 pages)
  - Includes April 1st and 40th Anniversary RFCs
- 115 I-Ds Submitted for publication
  - 87 IETF WGs
  - 15 IETF Individuals
  - 13 IRTF, IAB, and Independent combined

  - Abstract will appear between *Title* and *Status of This Memo*
  - Recommended order for RFCs:
    - Title
    - Abstract
    - Status of This Memo
    - IESG Note (if necessary)
    - Copyright Notice
    - Introduction

# IANA Activity since IETF 74 (actually Mar 2009-Jun 2009)



- Processed 1714 IETF-related requests, including:
  - 908 Private Enterprise Number requests
  - 75 port number requests
  - 52 TRIP ITAD Numbers
  - 52 media type requests
  - 42 language subtag related requests
- Reviewed 130 I-Ds in Last Call, and reviewed 110 I-Ds in IESG Evaluation
- Reviewed 102 I-Ds prior to becoming RFC, and 64 contained actions for IANA

# IANA Activity since IETF 74 (continued)



- <http://www.iana.org/about/performance/ietf-statistics>
  - Not more than 15 requests in any given queue, except:
    - port requests, which require expert review
    - media types, which has 64 requests from the same requester
- Continuing to convert protocol registries to XML
  - Goal to convert all registries by the end of 2009
  - Old legacy formats will be removed in next few months
  - Reminders will go to the IETF announcement list
- IANA Internet-Drafts:
  - RFC 3330bis completed IETF Last Call
  - IPv4 Special Purpose Address Registry has completed IETF Last Call
  - RFC 3171bis: Update guidelines for IPv4 Multicast Address Assignments
  - Developing I-D on port number review process
